Eyes

- Always have color
- Don't tell models to "look over there". Give them an object behind you to focus on so you can control their eye line.



Nose

- Don't cross the face
- If you draw an imaginary line down the side of their face, this is the line that cannot be crossed by their nose.



Hair

- Don't rest hair on top of the shoulders.
- There are 5 things you can do with hair.
 - All behind the shoulders
 - All in front of the shoulders
 - All on the left side
 - All on the right side
 - All pulled up



Chin/Ears

- Have models bring their ears forward as opposed to their chin up.



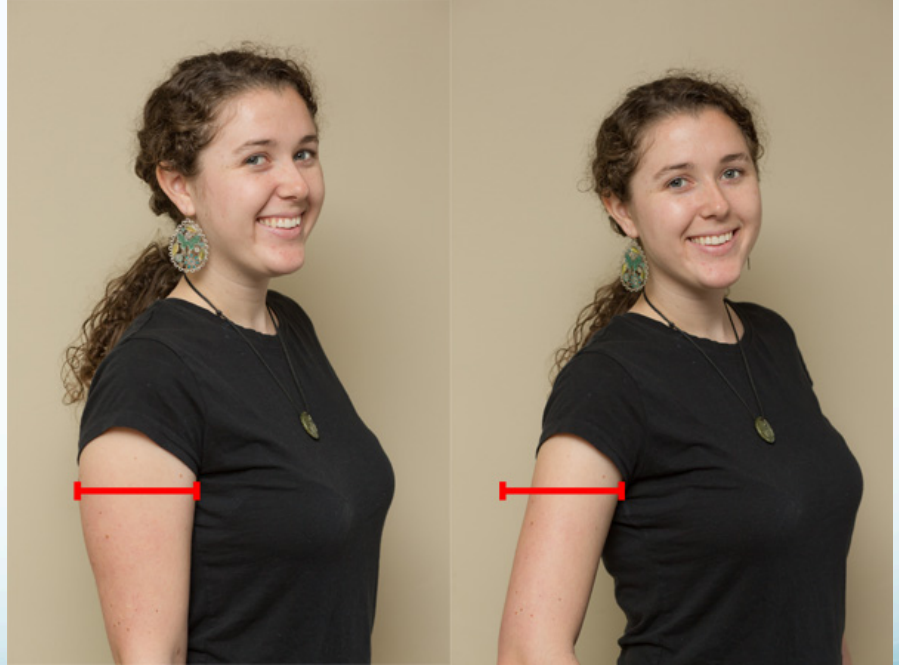
Shoulders

- Turn the shoulders.
- This will soften the appearance and show a slimmer profile.



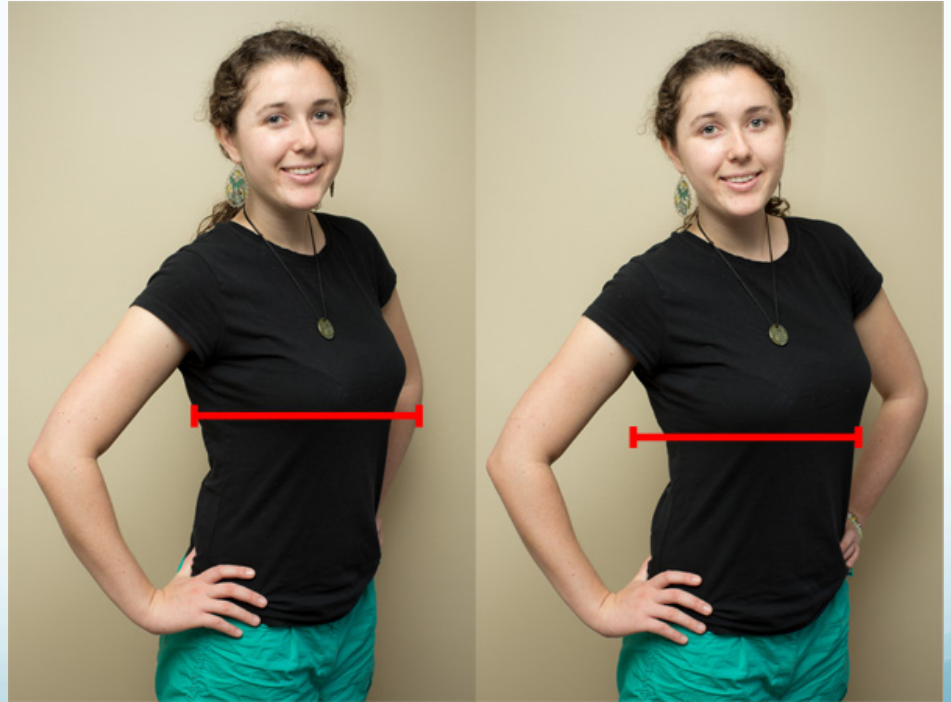
Arms

- Lift the arms
- This will make models look more comfortable and their arms will not be pressed against the torso.



Waist

- Leave visual space by the waist.
- This will leave models with their natural waist.



Bring it All Together

- Hair is behind one shoulder, in front of the other
- Chin is forward to create a strong jawline
- Arm is lifted from the torso
- Waist doesn't have any visual extenders
- Shoulders are turned
- Iris is seen over the whites
- Noes doesn't break the line of the face



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
